Lose your life?

Luke 9:24

Jesus warned us in Luke 9:24 that “Anyone who wants to save their life will lose it; but anyone that loses their life for my sake will save it”.

The word that Jesus uses for life is the word *psyche* which points not to the physical but to our soul, our inner self, our heart. A lot of the time our false self gets in the way of us becoming all that God created us to be. In the lyrics of “Steel Bars”, Andy Gullahorn sings “And this is how it feels when I know the man that I say I am is not the man that I am when no one’s around”.

Being a Christian, being Catholic, becomes even more clear when we give our lives to God. This is what is meant by ‘losing our life’ we find it in this daily relationship with God. We put off the false self and start to become all that we were created to be and do.
